EFAL Foundation Phase: COVID-19 MESSAGING

Good day, School Principals, please provide parents with the following tips on how to help their children with writing skills focusing on the stages of the writing process.

#### 1. Plan the writing

- Tell your child he/she must think about he/she is going to write.
- He/she share the thoughts or ideas out loud, so you can hear them.
- Next, give a few minutes to think about what he/she is going to write.

## 2. Draft the writing

- To get started, help your child with a writing frame, using a topic of his/her interest. Example, My Pet
- Writing Frame: I like my... because..... His name is ...and he can......
- Encourage him/her to write a few sentences.

#### 3. Edit the writing

- Tell him/her to read through what is written.
- Let him/her to note the mistakes of wrong spelling or incorrect sentence formation.
- Show your child how to correct the mistakes.

### 4. Publish and present the writing

- Get the child to neatly rewrite his/her final draft.
- Let him/her read the writing / story.
- Ask the child to include a drawing and to write his / her name on it.
- Display the writing for anyone to read.
- Praise the child for the good effort.
