Topic: Writing a summary of a novel

Message Objectives: To teach learners how to summarise a novel

## Message:

Summarizing is giving a short statement of the main points of something. When you summarise, you think about the most important points of a text. You explain the main points in a few, short sentences.

A summary shows that the reader has understood the main points of the text. It is written in one's own words.

## Steps

- 1. Read the novel.
- 2. Identify the most important parts of a novel.
- 3. Use the following questions as a guide:
  - **Introduction:** Who is the main character? What is the setting of the story?
  - Rising Action: What does the main character want? What is the problem or conflict?
  - Climax: What is the turning point of the story?
  - Falling Action: How do things calm down? How are parts of the story sorted out?
  - Resolution: How does the story end? What finally happens? What do the characters learn?
- 4. Draft the summary.
- 5. Check for mistakes, rewrite and publish it.
