Message:

Parental involvement is the active and ongoing participation of a parent or primary caregiver in the education process of their child. When parents are engaged in their children's school lives, children have the home support they need to excel in their studies. Here are the critical aspects that are impacted positively when parents are involved in school activities:

- Increased academic achievement
- Improved classroom behaviour
- Decreases absenteeism
- Overall impact on a child's personality
- Progress in disadvantaged children
- Encourages children to be more involved in many activities
- Improved teacher morale
- Opportunity to ask questions and voice concerns

How to increase parent involvement

- Teachers must give parents their contact details. That way, when parent have questions, they'll feel comfortable reaching out.
- Parents must be provided opportunities to take part in activities and assist whenever they
- Teachers must share their classroom goals and expectations openly with parents.
- Common challenges that inhibit parent engagement must be addressed immediately.

There are several ways in which parents can contribute at home: reading with children, monitoring and assisting with homework, and discussing school day and events.
