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1. INTRODUCTION

The National Education Collaboration Trust (NECT) herewith invites proposals from qualified service providers to submit proposals for the supply of online content for the Gender Responsiveness Pedagogy for Early Childhood Education (GRP4ECE) from English to Xitsonga and Tshivenda home languages.

The DBE and NECT seeks to procure competent service provider to continue the trajectory of accommodating other African languages by availing e-content in their languages. The service provider is expected convert e- content into Xitsonga and Tshivenda, generate video materials to support the content for ease access and comprehension and train targeted officials participating in the GRP4ECD namely Early Childhood Development (ECD) practitioners, Grade R Teachers and TVET Colleges without technical skills to training ECD practitioners on GRP4ECD. The Provincial Education Department's (PED's) in the three provinces (Limpopo, Mpumalanga and KwaZulu Natal will be supported through this project to ensure that targeted officials receive training on GRP4ECD.

A suitable service provider is therefore sought to undertake supply the items as per the set specifications in this Request For Proposals (RFP).

2. BACKGROUND

2.1. The NECT

The NECT was formed in July 2013 as a response to the call by the National Development Plan (NDP) for increased collaboration among stakeholders to improve educational outcomes.

The NECT is an organisation dedicated to strengthening partnerships with civil society, trade unions and government at national and provincial levels in order to achieve South Africa's national goals for basic education. It strives both to support and to influence the agenda for reform of education.

The organisation is based on the principle that collaboration and focused effort by important role players increases our power as a nation to secure the changes needed to deliver quality education to all our children.

NECT's point of departure is that government and civil society have different but complementary roles to play in relation to education. The provision of basic education for the general population is the responsibility of the government which is uniquely equipped to fulfil this overarching mandate. Civil society, with its diversity and flexibility, is able to support government by innovation and accelerated delivery. Civil society becomes more relevant and more influential when channelling its efforts in a coordinated way into the national education system.



2.2. Gender Responsive Pedagogy for Early Childhood Education (GRP4ECE) Framework

The programme design has been piloted by the DBE in collaboration with the South African based Vlaamse Vereniging voor Ontwikkelingssamenwerking en Technische Bijstand (VVOB), a Flemish Association for Development Cooperation and Technical Assistance. VVOB is already supporting the Department of Basic Education (DBE) in a Belgian-funded 5-year programme on inclusion and a 2-year programme on Gender Responsive Pedagogy (GRP). VVOB is also focusing on assisting DBE to implement Professional Learning Communities, a DBE teacher development project undertaken with the South African Council for Educators (SACE). The support comes as capacity development and support for national, district and provincial officials/systems/activities and as part of the above programmes.

VVOB has assigned staff to provide technical assistance to the DBE in the coordination of the training of trainers, develop Gender Responsive Pedagogy Content, an e-learning course on GRP (this will be paid for by the current GRP programme of VVOB to support the ETDP SETA aspect of the project). VVOB will also provide technical support in the rollout training to be coordinated by the Provincial Departments of Education (PEDs) with relevant TVET Colleges. The relevant materials in the form of the Gender Responsiveness Pedagogy for Early Childhood Education (GRP4ECE) Toolkit were developed as training content and are available as print-ready, as black, and white PDF format.

The ETDP SETA supported the first phase of GRP4ECE project in the training of approximately 4,000 Early Child Development (ECD) Practitioners, Grade R Education, School Leaders (Principals and Foundation Phase Heads) and ECD Centre Managers on the GRP4ECE Toolkit. The programme aimed to technically empower the trainees on using pedagogy to address gender inequality and harmful gender norms in four (4) provinces namely: Eastern Cape, Free State, Northern Cape, and North West. To this end, 4,000 Tablets were distributed in the four participating provinces for the initial phased implementation, with the GRP4ECE online toolkit installed to support continuous professional development of trainees in challenging gender stereotypes in the classroom. This programme is based on the firm principle of the National Strategic Plan (NSP) on Gender-based Violence and Femicide (GBVF) that creating an environment free of stereotypes lays a firm foundation for young children to grow up freely exploring and developing their unique interests and talents. With some adaptations, it can also be used with children under 3 years and in the broader primary school settings.

Through the distribution of tablets, the GRP4ECE makes an offering on Online Learner Management Course Modules on the impact of gender stereotypes that stop children from realising their full potential and identity and perpetuate GBVF. Educators play a central role in providing equal opportunities for all young children. ECD practitioners and Foundation Phase teachers will find in the GRP4ECE Learning Management System some courses to help promote gender equality with young children in the manner that play-based learning is conducted in the classroom environment.



The GRP4CED have entered the second phase by including provinces such as Limpopo, Mpumalanga and KwaZulu Natal. In the previous phase the programme catered for provinces such as Eastern Cape, Free State, and the Northern Cape. In these provinces e-content which was based in English was converted into languages that are spoken in the Eastern Cape (IsiXhosa); Free State (Sesotho) and the Northen Cape (Afrikaans). In the second phase, the NECT and DBE seeks to expand access of the e-content by accommodating other languages such as Xitsonga and Tshivenda.

3. CONDITIONS FOR THIS RFP

Bidding organisations are expected to comply with the conditions outlined below:

- a. Proposal must be submitted on the company letterhead.
- b. Proposal should be hand delivered to our offices placed in an envelope clearly marked with the RFP number and name submitted to the above-mentioned address. A full replicated electronic copy on a USB should be included in the submission documents.
- c. All service providers must submit their Black-Broad Based Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE) Verification Certificates from Verification Agencies accredited by the South African National Accreditation System (SANAS) or a Registered Auditor approved by the Independent Regulatory Board of Directors (IRBA) or an Accounting Officer as contemplated in the Close Corporation Act (CCA) or sworn affidavit for B-BBEE exempted micro enterprises in order to claim preference points.
- d. Evaluation criteria: 80/20 Preference Points System as presented in the preferential procurement regulations of 2017.
- e. Late and incomplete submissions will not be accepted

4. SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF THIS RFP

- a. Accepted RFP's will be communicated by way of an official purchase order. Accordingly, no goods; services or works must be prepared or delivered before an official purchase order is received by the respondent.
- b. All prices quoted must be firm for the period of the Tender and where applicable, must be inclusive of Value Added Tax (VAT).
- c. The lowest or any offer will not necessarily be accepted and the NECT reserves the right to accept any offer either in writing or in part.
- d. The offer shall remain binding and open for acceptance by the NECT during the validity period indicated and calculated from the closing time and date of this RFP.



5. SPECIFICATIONS

5.1. Purpose and Specifications of the RFP

The Purpose of the RFP is to invite interested service providers. The service provider will:

The service provider is expected to carry out the following activities.

- a. To utilize existing programme tools to adapt for eLearning to translate into Xitsonga and Tshivenda
- b. To adapt the Xitsonga and Tshivenda languages into existing programme for online learning.
- c. To create video module of programme for online learning.
- d. To ensure the design of e-content learning is seamless with LMS platform.
- e. Training of all beneficiaries on how to access the materials on-line.
- f. Provide technical support to officials and Early Childhood Development practitioners who many are not aquatinted with the technology.
- g. Provide training for all beneficiaries for a period of three (3) months.
- h. Liaise with the DBE and NECT on any technical issues.
- i. Provide the NECT with monthly reports for the duration of the project

5.2. Deliverables

- a. Collaborate with subject matter experts (VVOB) on course design, development, and delivery of E-Content which is seamless to the current Learning Management Systems (LMS).
- b. Creation of e-learning course by translating it from English to Xitsonga and Tshivenda
- c. Develop two (2) video material to translate text into visuals.
- d. Where possible, replace text with unanimated figures to drive a point home.
- e. Upload material on the existing LMS platform to ensure integrations.
- f. Upload the subtitles to be to ensure a wider access of the content.
- g. Train all beneficiaries on how to navigate the devices (tablets) to access content.
- h. Propose and implement appropriate techniques to adapt in-person materials to a virtual learning environment.
- i. Edit videos taken during the in-person course for use in the virtual course (videography will be done by the audio/visual support team for the in-person course).



5.3. Timeframes

The project is expected to last three (3) months period – therefore the service provider is expected to carry out all tasks outlined in these terms of reference for period of three (3) Months.

5.4. Required qualifications

- a. Educational Background: A degree in education, instructional design, educational technology, or a related field is often preferred.
- b. Relevant Experience: Demonstrated experience in eLearning development, preferably within a multilingual environment within South Africa.
- c. Technical Skills: Proficiency in eLearning development tools (e.g., Articulate Storyline, Adobe Captivate, Camtasia) and Learning Management Systems (LMS) preferred.
- d. Multimedia Production: Skills in video and audio editing, graphic design, and animation to create engaging and interactive learning materials.
- e. Communication: Excellent written and verbal communication skills for effective collaboration with subject matter experts and global teams.
- f. Cross-Cultural Competence: Experience in creating content for diverse and adapting materials for multi-language translation and cross-cultural considerations.

6. EVALUATION CRITERIA

1.1 Functionality

- a. The evaluation criteria for the assessment of the proposals will be based on both qualitative and financial aspects of the proposal.
- b. Service Providers will be evaluated on functionality. The bidders that score 70 points or more on functionality will further be evaluated on price and on Broad Based Black Economic Empowerment Status Level Certificates provided in terms of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework, Act 5 of 2,000 and Regulations of 2017.
- c. The Bid documents will be evaluated individually on a score sheet, by a representative of the evaluation panel according to the evaluation criteria indicated in the Terms of Reference.



- d. All bidders who score less than 70 out of 100 points for functionality will not be considered further. Service Providers will be shortlisted and may possibly be invited to do a presentation on their proposals at their own cost.
- e. Evaluation will be conducted in accordance with NECT Procurement Policy and Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Regulations of 2017.
- f. This bid will be evaluated on 80/20 Broad Based Black Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE) Status level contributor shall be applicable

In accordance with the NECT Procurement Policy, the bid evaluation process shall be carried out in three (3) phases namely:

Phase 1: Mandatory Requirement

Phase 2: Functionality Evaluation; and

Phase 3: Price and B-BBEE Evaluation

Step 1: Mandatory requirements

The failure to meet the following requirements or to provide the information requested below, may lead to an immediate disqualification.

The following documents must be attached with the submission:

- a) Valid and certified BBBEE Certificate or Exempted micro enterprise certificate signed by Registered auditor.
- b) Valid Tax clearance certificate
- c) Valid Company registration documents including Identity documents of Directors.
- d) Banking details original cancelled cheque or bank statement/ Confirmation letter.

Step 2: Functionality Evaluation

Minimum required score for functionality is 75 points out of 100 points and any bidder scoring less than 75 points will not be considered for further evaluation.
